CHAMBLEE ANIMAL CONTROL

"JR" is the Chamblee Animal control officer. He has been with the city for 35 years. His goal is to be a visible presence In the neighborhood. He likes to get to know the residents and pets. JR's goal is **not** to take your animal. If at all possible, he will return your pet to your door, and help you figure out how to keep your pet from getting lose again. The **MOST IMPORTANT** thing a pet owner can do is have a collar and **ID tag** on your pet. Micro chips are good also, JR can scan the pet. However, most pets are found/picked up by individuals and therefore the best method of ID is a tag. JR said you can get an inexpensive snap on plastic tag at Wal-Mart and put your phone number and address on it. (Article written by A. Metheny based on a telephone interview with JR; author note — I could not find any tags at Wal-Mart but PetSmart has some that hold a lot of info for less than \$8. Also, it can't hurt to include several phone numbers on the ID tag!)

Hurray for bike lanes!

DeKalb County has taken several more steps towards implementing our Traffic Calming plan. Bike lanes were painted on Longview Drive in early June. I have enjoyed seeing so many adults and children walking, running, riding bikes and pushing strollers in the bike lanes! I frequently walk on Longview and I feel much safer than I did before — and I hope you do, too. In addition, edge-of-pavement striping was added on several other streets including Admiral, Ellwyn and Plantation. While these are not wide enough to ride or walk in, they are intended to visually narrow the road, thus causing cars to drive more in the middle of the road and away from people walking and riding along the side of the road. In July, two new 4-way stop signs were installed at intersections that previously only had 2-way stop signs. I know that is has been an adjustment for those of us who have lived here a long time, but so far I haven't seen anyone run the stop signs.

The next phase will be the installation of 3 traffic circles on Longview and a center island in front of the park. The county traffic department is still working on the design for these. We will be the first neighborhood in DeKalb to have traffic circles, so there are a lot of things that have to be figured out as a 'pioneer'. I will update you via email as I learn more details.

The Huntley Hills Swim & Tennis Club had another terrific summer!

There are 13 new memberships left for sale before we start a wait list. You can pre-pay the initiation fee now to reserve your spot for 2012. CHAMBLEE CODE ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES

Officer JJ Davis provided the information on the right related to code enforcement violations in the Huntley Hills Subdivision for the past 3 months.

In addition, Officer Davis was also asked to provide the code rules related to vegetation and debris as a few neighbors were issued a code enforcement warning for tree limbs obstructing the road. Good information to know ...

Sec. 18-75. Vegetation and debris.

(a) Vegetation. There shall be no dead or hazardous trees, shrubs, ground cover or weeds likely to: harbor vermin or insects, create a health menace or fire hazard, restrict or impede access to or public use of adjacent sidewalks and streets, obstruct traffic-control signs and devices and fire hydrants, or pose a risk of physical injury to the public.

- b) Height of grass and weeds. Owners and occupants of property shall not permit weeds or grass within 150 feet of any building or structure to grow on such property to a height exceeding 12 inches.
- (c) Debris. There shall not be maintained on a property for more than seven calendar days any used or damaged lumber, junk, trash, debris, scrap metal, concrete, sand, asphalt, cans, bottles, tires, salvage materials, boxes, containers, bins, and abandoned, discarded, inoperative or unusable furniture, stove, refrigerator, freezer, sink, toilet, cabinet or other household fixtures, yard waste or equipment stored so as to be visible from public street, alley or from an adjoining property unless appropriate permits have been obtained from the city. Nothing herein shall preclude the placement of stacked firewood for use on the premises (in the side or rear yards of the premises.
